The OOK SNOW's low profile is rigorously designed to prevent falls. Its integrated bed-exit detection system helps reduce fall risks by alerting staff, allowing them to respond quickly.





The fully integrated weighing system is among the most precise available, allowing patient weight monitoring without disruption.

The new bed is intuitive and developed with the user in mind. The simple, standardized interface allows staff to save time and focus on patient care.



INTENSIVE & MODERATE FUNCTIONAL REHABILITATION

At Marie-Clarac, a dynamic team encourages rehabilitation patients to actively participate in their care plans and decision-making, helping them regain their independence.

PALLIATIVE CARE

The Mère Anselme-Marie Pavilion houses the Oasis de Paix, a palliative care unit that welcomes individuals at the end of life. Its mission is to ensure that everyone has access to high-quality end-of-life care, delivered with compassion and respect. Recognized as the largest palliative care unit with 36 rooms, the Oasis de Paix is more thanjust a place—it is a sanctuary designed to provide patients with the medical support they need to experience their final moments in a warm and dignified environment, surrounded by their loved ones. The goal is tocreate a haven of comfort, reassurance, compassion, and support, where each individual can find peace and tranquility during this delicate stage of life.
